From Father Mike

The Book of Wisdom sets out a ranking of values in today's first reading when it says, "I preferred [wisdom] to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her..." As Christians, we believe that this wisdom is rooted in the scriptures and flows from a life immersed in the Holy Spirit. This ongoing immersion is the day-to-day living of our baptism, and thus wisdom comes from our relationship with Jesus. So the implication of such a bold statement—preferring wisdom over power, influence, and wealth—is one that touches our lives all the time. Where I know that I can find this to be challenging is when I am thinking of the future and catch myself considering it a better one if I just had more money, resources, or control. In contrast, true wisdom sees a better future when our relationship with Christ is closer, deeper, and stronger. And the wonderful thing with this spiritual insight is that we do not have to wait for the resources to arrive or be acquired by us. Instead, we already have all we need right now through God's grace and our willingness to follow the Lord. Whichever way we envision the future will affect how we decide to spend our time and energy today. May each and every day we choose wisdom, and thus Christ himself, over all else.

CATHOLIC WOMEN GATHERING

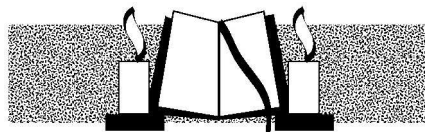
